How will you communicate your activities and results?

We are currently promoting the upcoming programs at WLIC and the 16th ILDS Conference via social media and IFLA web pages. We will be posting Conference papers and presentation slides on the ILDS web site (<https://ilds2019.org/>) starting September 1, 2019. We will be live-streaming Conference presentations, and we will offer presentation videos for viewing following the Conference. We have asked scholarship recipients to write a report of their experience at the ILDS Conference that can be shared on our web site. We will use similar methods for promoting and documenting any online classes and WLIC 2020 activities

How will you measure the impact of your activities?

Attendance numbers at the WLIC Open Session and at the ILDS Conference will be very important measurements. We also will measure social media and streaming engagement. We will conduct surveys following both of these events to gauge impact. We will also look at click counts on our conference proceedings and presentations as well as any online classes offered.

We are partnering with the Information Technology Section on a joint program at WLIC in Athens. We are partnering with the “Information Discovery and Delivery” journal to peer review and publish high quality content from the ILDS Conference. We are partnering with the National Repository of Grey Literature to host conference papers from the 16th Interlending and Document Supply Conference. We have secured an ISBN for these Proceedings, and they will be published as an ebook.

Both the slowness of international mail as it passes through customs and the difficulty in making payments for resource sharing transactions are key obstacles to access to information and sharing of resources with developing nations. These are both large problems that will have a massive impact when they are addressed. Due to the nature of the problem, incremental impact will not be possible. We must work towards a comprehensive solution which will then have a huge and visible impact.
