It was suggested to alternate (in-person Mid-year every second year, physical satellite in years in between) as this section has sometimes done so.
 - **ii. Agreement** to hold no more than 2 in-person meetings in 2020. If section hosts both Satellite and WLIC Session, then Mid-year Meeting will be held remotely.
